Working in watercolor and acrylics, students will be introduced to and learn the proper techniques when painting. Students will learn how to draw and paint various subject matters, such as animals and common landscapes/scenery that are popular to most students. With advance planning, student requests may be accommodated. Brief drawing instruction may be required during the planning stage of a student's painting process, but drawing is not a focus of this class.</i></p> <p><i>Most importantly, students get the benefits of classical instruction (often only taught in private lessons) while having fun creating some awesome paintings. We will study watercolor during fall semester and acrylic painting during spring semester. Some may just be curious to just learn how to draw, having not really focused on art before. All lessons are adaptable by grade, and designed to advance each individual student, regardless of skill level. Lessons build on top of each previous lessons, and students will be expected to continue working on the beginning lessons.</i></p> <p><i>Students will learn about the various methods for drawing accurately, the benefits of measuring, how to shade for realism, and to tie objects to the overall composition. The word "clog" has its origins in Gaelic and means "time." In clogging, students learn to dance in time with music to the downbeat, with the heel keeping rhythm. Students will learn basic to more advanced clogging steps, all while learning to count time to a variety of energetic and fun music. It is not designed for competition and does not have the intensity of sports training. Martial Arts promotes nonviolent resolutions to conflict, practical solutions to cardiovascular improvement, and enjoyable methods of exercise.</i></p> <p><i>This is a perfect class for those students who need a gym credit and is acceptable as a gym credit for accreditation purposes.
